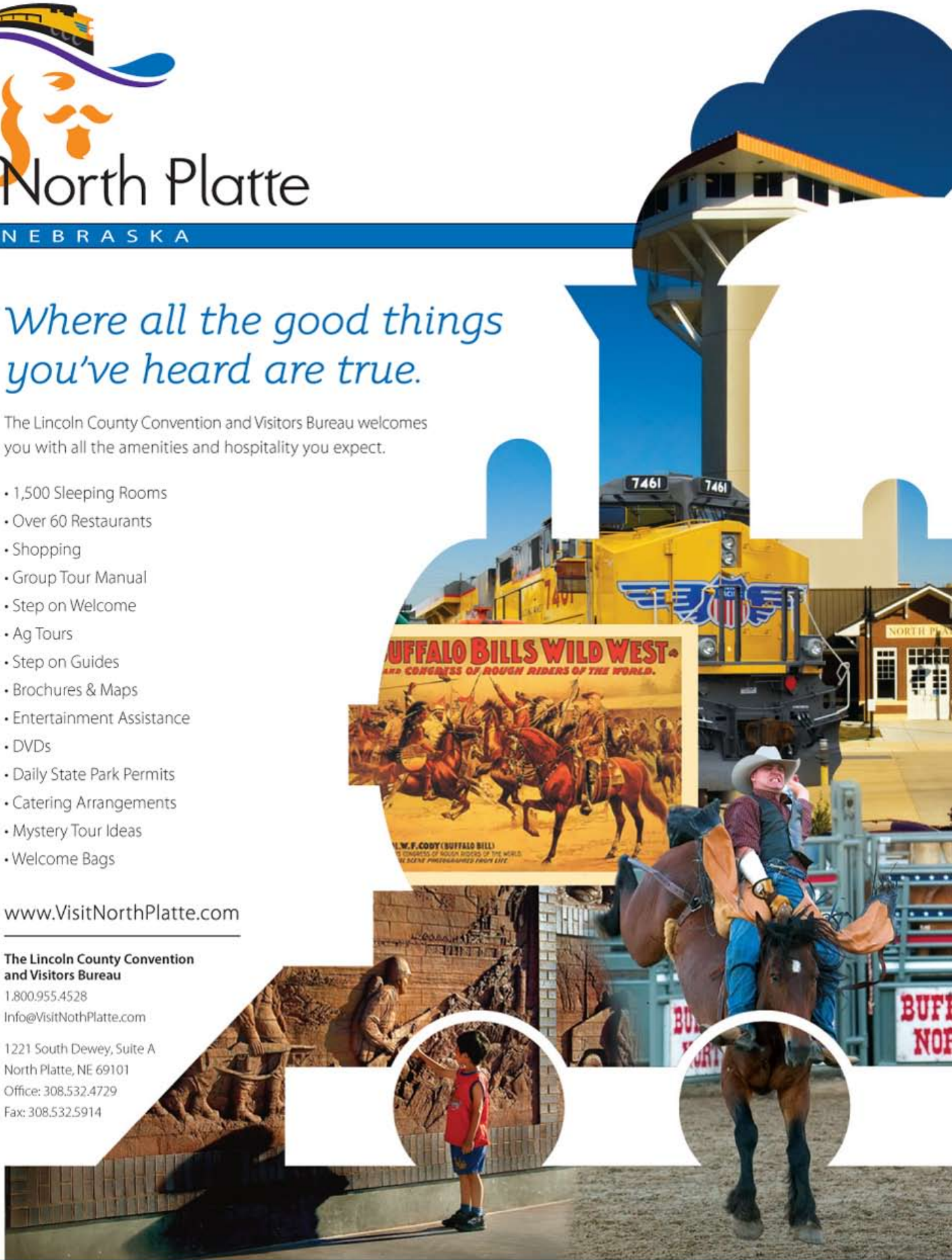
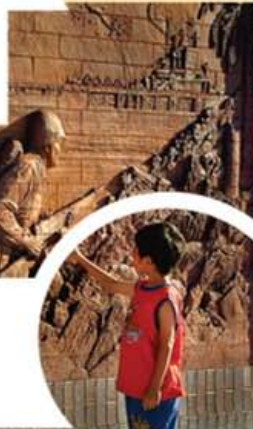

Buffalo Bill State Historical Park

1 hour



North Platte is the home of the man who made the Wild West world-renowned. Nobody personifies the frontier spirit better than William F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody, the west's most colorful showman. Visitors will get to know Buffalo Bill the man and the legend with a guided tour of his home and Scout's Rest Ranch show barn.

North Platte WWII Canteen

1 hour



The Lincoln County Historical Museum features displays from the famous World War II North Platte Canteen where over 6 million soldiers stopped as their troop trains passed through North Platte. Over 55,000 volunteers from nearly 125 communities supplied the soldiers with food, drink and a touch of home. Also on display is the Western Prairie Village featuring authentic buildings.

Cody Park Rail Road Museum

45 minutes



Step aboard Union Pacific's Challenger steam locomotive. This is the only display of its kind in the world! You'll also see U.P.'s #6922, the largest diesel locomotive ever made. Peek inside the historic Hershey Depot and climb aboard a mail car and caboose where you'll find historic railroad memorabilia.

Ride with the Wild Bunch

2.5 hours



Buffalo Bill welcomes you to Buffalo Bill State Historical Park! Followed by a Wild West shoot out on the streets of Old North Platte at the Lincoln County Historical Museum. You'll whet your appetite with a cowboy cook-out while listening to the music of an old time cowboy band. Event is customized for your group!

Golden Spike Tower and Visitor Center

1.5 hours



Rising 8-stories above the tracks, the Golden Spike Tower offers a panoramic view of Union Pacific's Bailey Yard from an open-air platform or enclosed viewing area. Over 10,000 rail cars pass through Bailey Yard each day, and you can see it all from atop the Golden Spike Tower and Visitor Center—More trains than you can keep track of. GoldenSpikeTower.com

20th Century Veterans Memorial

45 minutes



A permanent memorial dedicated to the military men and women of the United States. The five major armed services are memorialized by larger than life sized bronze statues. The memorial also features a Walk of Honor lined by thousands of commemorative bricks with the names of our veterans.

1 hour

Dancing Leaf Cultural and Learning Center

1.5 hours
